## Topic

A Kingdom United. Learning the chronology of the Saxon invasion of Britain leading into the Viking invasion. Comparing sources around this topic, addressing historical questions, and offering informed responses to a range of historical information. Locating different towns and cities in the UK with Saxon / Viking origins (including what their place names mean).

## **English**

Beowulf (Morpurgo) (Fiction), Beowulf (original poem) and Bede's Ecclesiastical History of the English People (AD731). Skills - word class and focus on Year 5 spellings ending in -ant, -ance, -ancy, -ent, ence, -able, -ible, -ably, ibly.

#### RE

To know that God loves us and calls us into a relationship with him and that God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. To understand that the Ten Commandments are a gift from God to help us.

Creating Media and Video Production. As they progress through this unit, they will be exposed to topic-based language and develop the skills of capturing, editing, and manipulating video.
