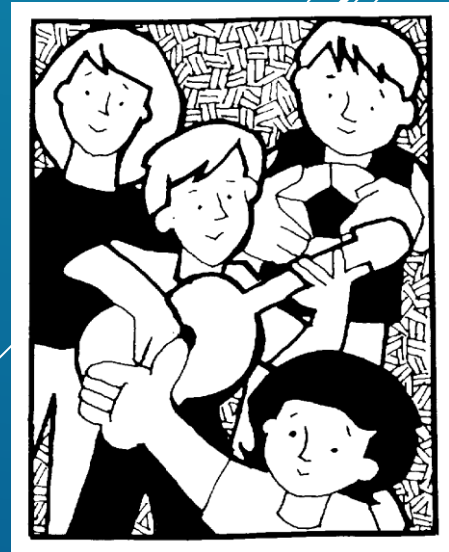
What is a Prayer Pilgrim?

Look after the prayer corner and prayer books in each class.

Lead prayers and hymns in assembly.

Help prepare assemblies, make posters and write prayers for assemblies.
