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NEWSLETTER NO 7: Thursday 22nd October 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

Its hard to believe that we have now come to the end of the first full term. I would like to thank you all for your support and help in following all the new routines. I hope that you all have a very relaxing half term and enjoy spending time with your children.

Black History Month

Our children have really enjoyed learning about Black History month in recent weeks and have produced some excellent work. Classes will be sharing some examples of their learning on their class dojo page so please have a look at their work. Some information about their learning is listed below.

St. John's class began the week by learning about Martin Luther King. We drew pictures of our dreams and made dream catchers. We read a book about Aretha Franklin and have made a stage to sing and dance to her music. We read a book about Muhammed Ali and practised skipping! We also read a book about Pelé and made our own footballs out of socks and paper like he did when he was a young boy and used them to play football.

St. Anthony's class read about the life of Maya Angelou and that, despite the struggles she faced, she never gave up with her own hopes and dreams. We talked about the unfair society she grew up in and how we should not judge others in this way. We then discussed one of her famous quotes, "I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel". We created some art work and writing to reflect on how our friends make us feel.

This week, St. Therese's class have been focussing on Mary Seacole. The children have all written and decorated a thank you card for Mary Seacole, thanking her for her inspirational work as a nurse during the Crimean War. They then designed a medal for her, and each child decided which quality they were awarding the medal for, some examples are courage, determination and kindness. Finally, the children each produced a portrait of Mary Seacole, and used watercolours to paint their portrait.

In St. Patrick's class we have been learning about Harriet Tubman, a pioneer who fought for civil rights. Harriet was at the forefront of equal rights in the 1800's. She set up her own care home to support people who were in need and she was also a spy for the Union in America during their civil war. She was a pioneer that is still considered to be one of the main figureheads in ensuring all people were treated equally in America, regardless of race, religion or appearance.

St. Nicholas' class have enjoyed learning about the inspirational Maya Angelou by creating posters about who she is and her achievements, writing poetry inspired by her poem 'Be a rainbow in someone else's cloud' and making colourful self-portraits to celebrate their own identities and aspirations for their future.

In St. George's, we have spent time learning about the Empire Windrush and 'The Windrush Generation'. To begin with, it was important to spend time researching these topics, learning what and who they were as well as why they are significant-including discussion on why 'The Windrush Generation' have been in the news in more recent times. We used news reports and photographs from the 1940's to generate discussion as to what life was like for those who arrived from the Caribbean, including the difficulties they faced which ranged from dealing with the change in climate to the more serious issue of racial discrimination. We also used the poetry of John Agard to help us imagine what it would have been like to be aboard the ship, making the voyage to settle in another country. Our work culminated in creating a poster reminding ourselves that we are all 'Created in the image and likeness of God', regardless of our differences and that, as such, each person should be treated with the same dignity and respect that we ourselves would wish to be treated.

St. Francis' class have been learning about Martin Luther King. The children have been composing fact files and biographies about his life. They have also been composing their own 'I have a dream' compositions inspired by Doctor King's famous speech.

Bike / Scooter Compound

We are delighted that our bike / Scooter compound has now been completed and is available for use. A letter was sent via ParentMail explaining the terms and conditions of use. We hope that this will encourage children to develop healthier lifestyles by cycling or scootering to school. This hopefully will also mean less transport by car to school thus helping the congestion in the close.













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Cashless School

It is our ambition to become a cashless school. We feel that in order to keep our school community safe during the current health crisis we intend to reduce the need to handle money or cheques. We also believe that many parents will find it easier to make digital payments as opposed to more traditional transactions as our ParentPay app means that payments can be made anywhere, at any time using a digital device. As a result, we are encouraging parents to make payments via the ParentPay App. Many of you already use this and are familiar with its use through ordering school lunches. We intend to extend the use of ParentPay to include other school events across all year groups. We hope that all parents will choose to use this method to pay for school events in the future. At the moment we are inviting parents in Year 6 to pay for the school trip to Kent Life. In addition, we have also created a pathway to allow parents to pay their school fund contribution through the app. If you need help accessing your ParentPay account or need a reminder of your activation code please contact the school office.

Parents Evenings Information

All parents have now received their child / children's parent evening report. Just a reminder that should you wish to have a telephone consultation please contact the office so that a mutually convenient time can be arranged. This will be available until Friday 6th November.

School Winter Uniform is to be worn from Monday 2nd November.

In addition to our current uniform, we will shortly be introducing a navy-blue zipped fleece jacket as an additional item of school uniform which can be worn over (not in place of) the school sweatshirt / cardigan. Full details of this non-compulsory item of uniform will be provided in Term 2.

Hot Meals Restarting

This week saw the restart of our hot meals service. The children have really enjoyed having hot deals again. My thanks to all the staff of Contract Dining Company and the mid-day meals supervisors for their efforts in realising this. Should you want your child to have a hot meal please be aware, all meals are to be paid for via the contactless ParentPay app system at a cost of £2.05 each for KS2 children. No charge for children in KS1 and those children entitled to free school meals. Please also note that all meals are to be paid for on or before the day that they are eaten. The school office can provide you with your child's activation codes should they have been misplaced. The current menu has been sent home via ParentMail last week, a copy is also available from the school fover for your information.

ClassDojo

We would like to use Classdojo as an opportunity for you to gain an insight into your child's learning experience at St. William of Perth and share in some of our valued traditions. Every child has been given a paper copy of a letter to bring home to you today (also sent via ParentMail as an attachment to this newsletter). We ask that you confirm or decline permission as requested, returning your reply slip to the class teacher via your child / children week commencing 2nd November.
