Dear Parents and Carers,



Welcome back to Term Two. I trust that you all had an enjoyable break as we now prepare for the term that lies ahead. Thank you also for the support and understanding that you have shown this week. As you're aware, Year 4 are currently self-isolating due to a positive case of COVID-19. We are missing them from our school family, but I'm sure you'll join with me in sending our thoughts and prayers to them at this time and we look forward to having them back with us. I would like to thank you for your continued support during these troubled times as we once again find ourselves in another lockdown. However, we have worked together really well since last March and with constant reviews of risk assessments, and following up-to-date Government guidelines, and of course your support, we have been able to keep the children safe while maintaining excellent attendance. It is a difficult time for everyone and we appreciate the effect that this is having on our school community. I'm sure you will also join with me in thanking the staff of St. William of Perth who have continued to work to ensure your children are happy, safe and flourishing.

Attendance

As you are aware we are now in another National Lockdown, but we remain open. It remains very important for children to attend, to support wellbeing and education and working parents/carers.

Health Reminders - A reminder to parents: dropping off and collecting children from school

With lockdown measures coming into force yesterday, it's now more important than ever for you to follow social distancing rules when dropping off and collecting your child/children. Social distancing is vitally important to prevent the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19).

Please remember that when dropping off or picking up your child/children, you should:

- Wash your hands (20 seconds = a thorough wash) or use hand sanitiser before you arrive at school;
- Keep more than 1 metre apart from other parents and staff (ideally 2 metres);

• Only one member of your household should arrive at the school gates to collect your child/children (to help reduce the number of people at the school gate during pick-up times);

• Do not gather at the gates/outside school and leave as soon as you have seen your child walk through the gate. Using the one-way system by crossing over to the other side of Canon Close.

• If you need to visit the school reception area, then a face covering must be worn.

Please note that face coverings are optional to wear outside of the school; you can choose to decide to wear one at the school gates/outside school.

Ventilation

Following Government guidance to minimise the spread of the virus we have been following advice to keep rooms as well ventilated as possible. With the weather becoming colder we are aware that rooms are a little chillier than usual. While the heating will be on to warm the building, the need for constant ventilation of classrooms means that the effectiveness of the heating throughout the day may be compromised. Can you therefore, please ensure that all children have a school jumper/ cardigan to wear at all times. If your child is particularly susceptible to the cold then a base layer of a vest or t-shirt might be suitable as well.

New Addition to our School Uniform

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, we have added a navy fleece zip jacket to our school uniform list. This **non-compulsory** fleece is to be worn **over the top of** school jumpers/cardigans **not in place of them.** The fleece is available to purchase for £12.25, directly from our school uniform supplier Brigade, and can be viewed and ordered via the following link: <u>http://www.brigade.uk.com/content.php?page=select_school&for=parents</u> Please note that the fleece will include the embroidered school logo.

To commemorate Remembrance Day and in support of the Poppy Appeal, we have been selling poppies. Thank you to everyone who has helped to support this worthwhile charity. On Wednesday we will be holding a two-minute silence at 11 am to honour the brave men and women who have given their lives in conflicts.

New Internal Classroom Doors

During half term we had new classroom doors installed as part of our drive to improve the security and safeguarding of our school site. The children have been commenting on how nice the new doors look. My thanks to the contractors for their hard work.

PTA Bag2School Thank you to all those who donated clothes to support the bag2 school fund raising initiative. With your help and support £117 has been raised for the school.

PTA Cake sale - Thank you also to those who supported the PTA cake sale on Wednesday - we raised £122 for the school. Thank you for supporting the school.

Cashless School

It is our ambition to become a cashless school. We feel that in order to keep our school community safe during the current health crisis we intend to reduce the need to handle money or cheques. We also believe that many parents will find it easier to make digital payments as opposed to more traditional transactions as our ParentPay app means that payments can be made anywhere, at any time using a digital device. As a result, we are encouraging parents to make payments via the ParentPay App. Many of you already use this and are familiar with its use through ordering school lunches. We intend to extend the use of ParentPay to include other school events across all year groups. We hope that all parents will choose to use this method to pay for school events in the future. In addition, we have also created a pathway to allow parents to pay their school fund contribution through the app. If you need help accessing your ParentPay account or need a reminder of your activation code please contact the school office.

If you have not already done so, we ask that you ensure your child hands their agreement to their class teacher on Monday.
