If the weather should become severe

Every winter brings the possibility of snow and ice. Extreme bad weather can cause widespread and prolonged disruption. Schools are often affected and it can be difficult to maintain an education service.

As a fundamental principle, every effort must be made to keep schools open, even if only limited numbers of pupils can attend. However, schools may close due to 'unavoidable' circumstances. Those circumstances being that it is no longer safe for staff or pupils to be onsite. We recognise that it is important our school remains open so parents are able to work and pupils can continue to learn. St. William of Perth Catholic Primary School will make every effort to prepare for severe snow/ice this winter by gritting pathways, clearing access points etc. However, if we do experience severe snow/ice resulting in hazardous conditions, we may have to take the decision to close the school. In the first instance please check the school website: www.stwilliamofperth.org.uk where a notification will be posted or check your email for a message from the school via ParentMail. Alternatively, you can go online to see if the school is closed at Kent County Council's school closures page or tune into RADIO KENT (96.7FM, 104.2FM or 97.6FM, website www.bbc.co.uk/kent) or HEART FM (103.1FM or 102.8FM, website www.heart.co.uk/kent) or KMFM (106fm, website www.kentschoolclosures.co.uk) to listen to the School Closure messages.

What can you do to help?

- Please visit www.kent.gov.uk/winter for more information about gritting routes and travel issues around Kent so you can plan your journey.
- Don't forget suitable warm clothing gloves, hats, scarves, wellies etc. or even a change of clothing (please ensure that all clothing is clearly named).
- If you are a working parent or feel you may have a problem with a sudden earlier pick up, please could you put a back-up plan in place with another family member or parent and inform the school. This will allow staff to leave earlier for their safety if weather dictates. If you would be willing to help Mr Mennie (Caretaker), clear snow, should we have any, please email office@stwilliamperth.medway.sch.uk or call into the school office. We will then be able to add your details to our list.
