<u>Covid</u>

Cases continue to rise in the local community. We encourage all our families to follow the government's plan B guidance. As always, we ask that if your child is presenting with symptoms that they remain at home and undertake a test. Any visitors to our school site are asked to wear a mask while on site. Please remember hands, face, space as key measures to help everyone stay safe. We continue to implement strict control measures within school including hand hygiene, ventilation and cleaning regimes. It is vital that we all do our part in reducing transmission of the virus so we can continue to give your children the best educational experience possible with the least disruption in these challenging times.

<u>Uniform</u>

Earrings, Hair and Uniform reminder

Our uniform and being smart is very important. We ask for your support in ensuring that the uniform policy is adhered to. Our high expectations for presentation contribute to the high standards of behaviour that our school is renowned for.

Earrings: We do discourage ear piercing during the academic year as the children are unable to participate in any PE activities until they are able to remove them independently. This is a legal requirement under Health and Safety. It is much better if they are pierced at the beginning of the summer holiday.

A reminder that any earrings worn should be **plain gold or silver studs** i.e. not diamantes or different shapes.

Hair: Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back from the face, not cover the eyes and hinder learning. Please remember that hair bands should be plain black or blue or in the school colours. Tram lines and other extremes of fashion are not allowed.

Due to current government guidelines with regard to class ventilation; those children that are feeling the cold within class are encouraged to wear extra clothing beneath their school uniform. In addition to the school sweatshirts and cardigans, children are also invited to wear a school fleece bearing the school logo, available to purchase directly from our school uniform supplier, Brigade Clothing which can be viewed and ordered via the following link:

It is recommended that you order a size larger than normal to account for it being worn over school uniform.

Until further notice, all other items of school uniform will remain available to purchase from the school office.

Please ensure **all hats are in plain school colours or is a school hat** i.e. **not** furry animal ears, fancy muffs, ear muffs etc.... School knitted hats are available from the school office and are currently charged at £4.70 each.

Year 6 swimming will restart this Tuesday. Please ensure your child has a coat as the children will be attending even if the weather is inclement.

Severe Weather

As we are going to be experiencing much colder weather over coming months, I thought it would be helpful to remind parents about how we would communicate school closure to you.

Please be assured that we will open the school if at all possible.

1. A notice will be placed on the school website by 7.00am. So please keep an eye on the front page of the website. This should be your first port of call.

2. We will send a ParentMail.

3. We will contact Heart FM who will list on their website, schools that they know to be closed.

4. There will be a notification on the Medway Council website under school closures.

Please do not presume that if the Maths School and Rochester Grammar are open that St. William of Perth will be open. The needs of a 5 year old child in terms of staffing and welfare are not the same as a teenage child and a higher staff ratio is required.

How do we make a decision as to whether the school can open? -

I was asked a couple of years ago when we last had bad weather how we make a decision on whether the school should close in severe weather. Essentially, I don't make the decision by myself. I consult head teachers of other local schools, seek guidance from the local authority and agreement of the Chair of Governors.

The following are examples of the types of issues that are taken into account when undertaking a risk assessment before deciding whether to open or close:

- 1. Is it possible to provide adequate staffing cover for all or some of the pupils? Are sufficient numbers of staff able to get in to school safely?
- 2. Will sufficient first aiders be on site? Will first aid cover be available?
- 3. Will there be adequate supervision of children at lunchtime and break times? Will there be sufficient support staff available in class to assist with children with special needs etc. and the particular demands of pupils with medical needs or disabilities?
- 4. Will there be health and safety issues, e.g. insufficient heating, frozen pipes, iced pavements?
- 5. Are the surrounding roads safe for travel? Would emergency vehicles be able to attend the school to assist a child or staff member if needed.
